CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL TRAINS OPEN FOR BUSINESS

Racing fans travelling to the 2010 Cheltenham Festival are being advised to reserve their train tickets in advance as CrossCountry today announced they will once again be operating extra services and larger trains to the popular race meet.

Race goers from across Britain, Ireland and mainland Europe will flock to the historic Cheltenham Racecourse between Tuesday 16th and Friday 19th March and are being advised to avoid the expected congestion by taking the train and the option of a 'bus add-on' ticket – available to buy via crosscountrytrains.co.uk

Aside from CrossCountry's 94 daily scheduled services stopping at Cheltenham, during race week there will be an additional two trains per day operating south from Derby (via Birmingham New Street) and north from Cheltenham.

CrossCountry has also launched a special 'bus add-on' ticket which can be used on the regular Stagecoach-operated shuttle bus service that will be serving Cheltenham station and taking people to the racecourse.

Andy Cooper, CrossCountry's Managing Director said; "The Cheltenham Festival is a highlight in the national racing calendar so it makes sense for us to operate extra services and larger trains throughout that week. We are well prepared for the extra customers and hope everyone planning to travel with us will take the hassle-free option of booking their Cheltenham train and bus add-on tickets through our website. We are looking forward to transporting as many race goers as possible to Cheltenham for what promises to be yet another fantastic four days."
