

# Horton Road level crossing closure

This summer, Network Rail is replacing a section of track at Gloucester station to improve performance and reliability.

Horton Road level crossing will be closed to pedestrians and vehicles from 11.40pm on Saturday 20 July to 6.00am on Saturday 27 July to enable us to carry out the work safely.

### Pedestrian diversion routes

The step-free diversion route via London Road is 1.3 miles and takes approximately 25 minutes to walk.

The stepped diversion route is via the subway to the west of the main entrance to Gloucester station. It is 1.1 miles and takes approximately 23 minutes to walk.

### Minibus service

We will be providing a minibus service around the clock from one side of the crossing to the other. It will also stop at Gloucestershire Royal Hospital. We are aiming to provide a minibus every 20 minutes, although this will depend on traffic conditions.

### Vehicular diversion route

The diversion route for motorists is 1.6 miles and should take an average of 11 minutes, depending on traffic conditions. The route is via Derby Road, Barton Street, Bruton Way, London Road and Great Western Road.

Please leave extra time for your journey.

### Travelling by train?

No trains will be able to call at Gloucester on Sunday 21 and Monday 22 July.

There will be changes to services from Tuesday 23 to Friday 26 July inclusive, with some trains calling at Gloucester.
