Play our Tracks & Trains game!



Follow the same rules as a traditional game of snakes & ladders. You will need a dice and some counters. Each player begins their journey in the "START" square.

Throw the dice to move forward. If a player lands on the end of a **red tracks** arrow - eg. square 36 - they move back down the board.

If a player lands on the end of a **yellow trains** arrow - eg. square 29 - they zoom up the board.

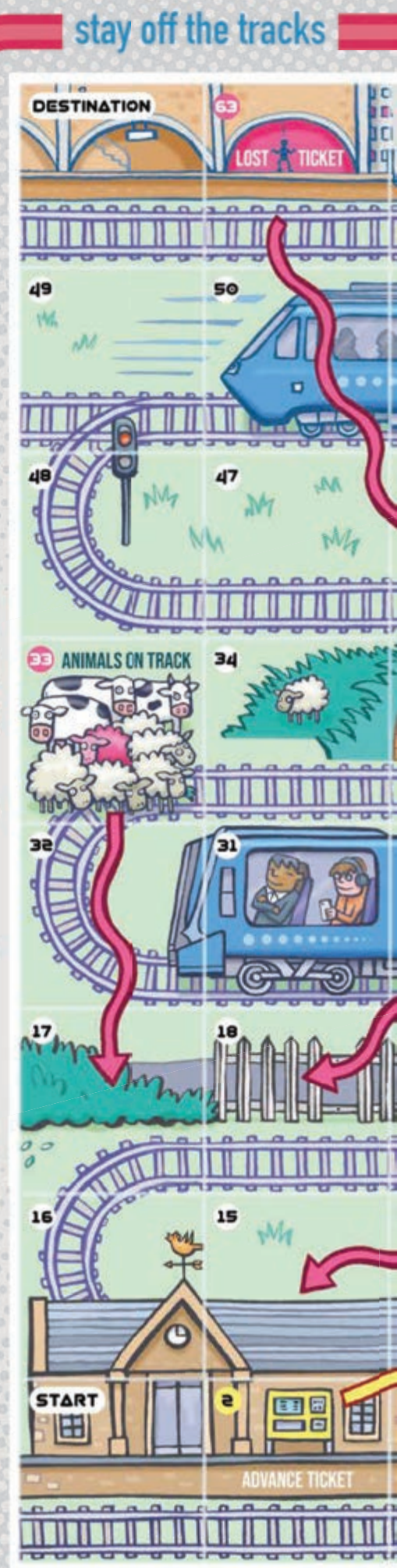
The first player to land on "DESTINATION" is the winner of the game!

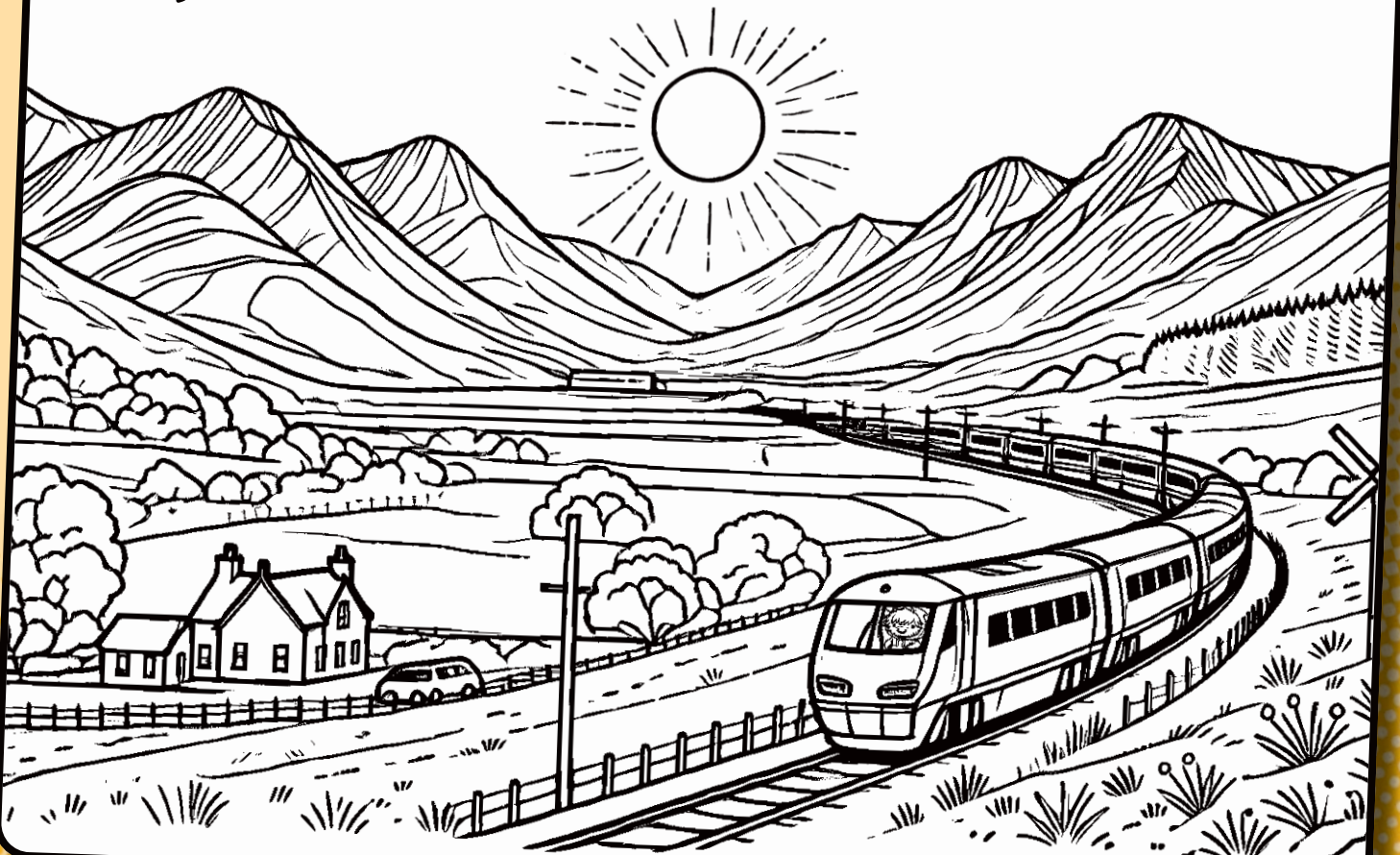
